



From the Pastor's Desk...

In the image of a good Shepherd, much is said about the identity of Jesus to His followers and how they should see Him. But Jesus first reminds His listeners how the sheep of a flock are protected by such a good Shepherd. To protect them at night from thieves or wild animals, the shepherd would construct a makeshift "sheepfold," a crude enclosure of stone or brush, encircling the sheep.

This structure was simple and primitive, but the opening or gate into this sheepfold is important in today's Gospel. The gate into this circle provided entrance and exit for the animals. At night, the shepherd himself would lie across the opening. He could not only prevent the animals from wandering away, but also he was the first defense against wild animals or thieves who would seek to do harm to the sheep.

The gatekeeper would only admit those who should have access to the sheep. These timid animals responded only to the voice they knew, the voice of their shepherd. The good shepherd, entering the gate, would lead out during the day only those who recognized his voice, leading them to pasture for food and protective care. All others who were not admitted through the gate by the gatekeeper, had to climb over the encircling wall. These, Jesus said, only sought to do harm to the sheep – or steal them.

This is the identity of Jesus for His followers: "I am the gate." Consider the relationship Jesus is describing, between Himself and His disciples. When He calls them, they recognize His voice and respond to His call. This shepherd's voice is familiar to them. There is trust, comfort, and safety in His tone and manner. He lies down in the gate to protect the sheep from harm. When He leads them out, they find safety, food and protection in the pasture.

We have all been called by name to be members of the sheepfold at Baptism. We, in turn, as disciples, need to become familiar with the voice of the Good Shepherd, Jesus Christ himself. We belong to Him as the adopted sons and daughters of God, again through our Baptism. In Him we find guidance, protection and nourishment (the Eucharist) when we go out into the world to live the Gospel message. Let our faith – which is our response to the call of the Shepherd – increase our trust and confidence in the Risen Lord. The Good Shepherd, in turn, provides protection from all that would harm us, even when we should wander away and become lost.

Jesus Christ is risen! **Happy Easter Season!** Fr. Bill Arnold

Holv Communion "Under Both Species:" Bishop Earl Fernandes has granted permission on a trial basis (ad experimentum in Latin) to resume receiving Holy Communion under the

sacramental signs of bread and wine. The liturgical practice of receiving Holy Communion (the Precious Blood) from a common cup was discontinued at the very beginning of the COVID-19 pandemic in March of 2020.

Here at Holy Spirit and St. Philip the Apostle Parishes, we shall resume the protocols used prior to the onset of COVID-19. The Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion will offer the chalice to the communicant and say "The Blood of Christ;" the communicant responds, "Amen" and receives the cup with two hands into his/her own hands; consumes a modest portion (sip) from the cup and hands the cup back to the minister. Please perform this sacramental action slowly, conscientiously, and reverently.

Receiving Holy Communion from the cup remains OPTIONAL, should anyone have health concerns or still be wary of contracting any illness (or virus). The full physical and spiritual presence of Jesus Christ in the Eucharist is contained in the consecrated host, without reception from the cup being seen as something "additional" or "extra." No additional grace is received by reception under both sacramental signs.



Having a Child Baptized?

Here at Holy Spirit, we have some helpful guidelines in preparing a family to have their child baptized.

- All parents must attend a Baptism Preparation class. The class is offered on the third Sunday of every month after the 11:00 a.m. Mass, in the parish office. Preregistration for this class is requested at least one week prior to the class.
- In order to register for the Baptism Preparation Class, the parents must be registered parishioners of Holy Spirit for at least 6 months. If you are not currently registered, we can assist you and register you for an upcoming class.
- Generally, Baptisms take place after 11:00 a.m. Mass on the first and last Sundays of the month. Please note that other children may be baptized on the same day as your child. We do not baptize during the season of Lent. We also do not schedule Baptisms on Sundays that take place near Holy Days or major holidays.
- The Sacrament may be celebrated in English or Spanish. Please understand that a Baptism may be scheduled in another language on the Sunday you desire. Your child's Baptism may need to be scheduled on another Sunday.


