From the Pastor's Desk...



Today is the feast of Pentecost, fifty days after the celebration of the Resurrection. Today's liturgy is a celebration of the Spirit of God, the energizing, inspiring, and

comforting presence of God with us, the Church, until the end of time. The Church of today experiences the same anxiety and apprehension as did the first disciples after the departure of Jesus from this world. But we, like the early disciples, must recognize the overwhelming presence of the Spirit, that Spirit which provides the driving energy to spread the Gospel. It is the same spirit which brings direction and peace to the faithful in difficult times.

Consider the two readings from the Sunday liturgy. The Acts of the Apostles presents a chaotic scene, described in terms of the fearful, awesome forces of nature. A driving, powerful wind fills the room where the disciples gathered. Tongues of fire part upon each of those present. Fire was an essential element of the natural order, used to create and destroy, needed for warmth and light. This is an important moment in Salvation History, when all are filled with the fire of the Holy Spirit. The power of this Spirit enabled all to speak and proclaim the great deeds of God. It enabled the listeners to understand, without difficulty or confusion, that the overwhelming power of God accompanies all human history.

The Gospel retells the event of that first Sunday of Resurrection faith when the disciples, confused and huddled in fear, recognize the risen Christ in their midst. His first words, "Peace be with You" are spoken to impart reassurance and strength. When Jesus breathes on them, (symbolic of the driving wind of the Spirit), Jesus empowers his disciples to preach and bestow forgiveness to a waiting world.

Today, for the Church, our parish, and for ourselves personally, we pray for a new Pentecost. We need not recoil in fear or apprehension when we experience the difficulties of being a strong believer, a faithful Christian. We have been given power to preach peace and forgiveness in the face of hatred and vengeance. The Spirit accompanies us in these necessary tasks as our words and deeds proclaim the presence of the Spirit to people who have grown weary, and to many who have never heard. Let us allow the Spirit into our lives, to energize, to direct and inspire, and to comfort us.



Almighty ever-living God, who govern all things, both in heaven and on earth, mercifully hear the pleading of Your people and bestow Your peace on our times. Through our Lord Jesus Christ, Your Son who lives and reigns with You in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever.



Feast of Pentecost: This is the great "birthday" of the Church, the Feast of Pentecost. The Holy Spirit descended upon the Church

gathered in prayer. From this day forward, the early disciples went forth and courageousely preached the Gospel to the ends of the world. The Spirit was then, and remains now, our constant guide. This is our prayer today, and every day: "Come Holy Spirit, fill the hearts of your faithful, and kindle in them the fire of your love; Send forth your Spirit and they shall be recreated, and you shall renew the face of the earth."

Blessings & Talents: We have all received so much from God. Our blessings are not always recognized or acknowledged, but what we have been given is truly amazing.

The coming of the Spirit on this Pentecost Sunday reminds us that the Spirit of God inspires us to grow, to seek a deeper and more insightful relationship with God and the Church. The grace of God works in us and is able to help us do greater things.



Allow the Spirit to be at work in your life. Memorial Day, 2023: Each year, we observe this national holiday in memory of those men and women who served this country in its moments of greatest need, and who paid the ultimate price – they gave their lives. Memorial Day serves as a reminder of these dedicated members of the American Armed Forces who never came back to family, friends, and loved ones.

Our most recent memories of loved ones lost in the wars of the Persian Gulf, Iraq and Afghanistan weigh heavily on the hearts of their family members and friends, especially since they "volunteered" to take on these difficult challenges. That does not lessen the sacrifices or loss of those who died in the great wars of the twentieth century, World Wars I and II, Korean and Vietnam, when eligible young men were subjected to the military draft.

We pray to God for their eternal rest. We pray to God in gratitude for their sacrifice. We pray to God that peace comes to our troubled world.



Help Protect the Dignity of Life in Ohio: Life in its earliest and most vulnerable stages is threatened by groups proposing an amendment to the Ohio Constitution for the November 2023 ballot to expand and enshrine abortion at the expense of protections for preborn children

and women. The Catechism of the Catholic Church proclaims that "human life must be respected and protected absolutely from the moment of conception." The Church accompanies and supports women facing unexpected pregnancies and mothers through programs like Walking with Moms in Need and the services of Catholic Charities

The bishops of Ohio strongly encourage Catholics statewide to unite in prayer and work to defeat this proposed amendment and its grave consequences for women and preborn children in Ohio. Starting this week, the following *Protect Them Both* materials about the proposed amendment are available in Ohio parishes:


