

From the Pastor's Desk...

One thing becomes very clear as you hear (or read) today's Gospel. Even after all the experiences the disciples had with Jesus, and after all His instruction, they did not share His idea of God. Two apostles, Thomas and Philip, are front and center in this Gospel, and from their discussion with Jesus, it is obvious that they are either slow learners, or they simply have not adopted Jesus' understanding of Himself or His view of God. Jesus "explains Himself" one more time, to both of them and also to us

Jesus teaches His disciples that they should not be fearful at His departure. In fact, He is leaving to prepare a place for them and Jesus reminds them that they know where He is going. Jesus must have sighed deeply when Thomas declared: "Master, we do not know where you are going, so how can we know the way." Jesus patiently explains, one more time, that He is the way, the truth, and the life. If we want to come to the Father, we come through Jesus. To know Jesus, is to know the Father. When we see Jesus, we see the Father.

Then Philip asks of Jesus, "Show us the Father and that will be enough for us." Again, from the beginning, Jesus explains to Philip that whoever has seen Jesus has seen the Father. Jesus asks them to think over what they believe, and He challenges them to think and reflect again: "How long have you been with me? Do you not think the Father and I are one? The words I speak are not my own. The works I do are the Father's work. You have already experienced the Father."

The disciples have not grasped a great many things. They have experienced the mercy, generosity and forgiveness of the Father in Jesus, and yet they still desire a privileged peek to see the Father. They have witnessed Jesus walking with the wounded, the outsider, and the rejected, and they still reject the notion of the cross. They have heard Jesus challenge their image of God as a remote, distant God, whose behavior mirrors the petty faults of ordinary human beings. In the life and the ministry of Jesus, they have seen how God does things. This truth they have not yet really accepted or understood.

Fr. Michael Simone, S.J., for *America* magazine once wrote: "Our Gospel reading today reminds us that in Jesus, we encounter all we know of God... Jesus is God's only self-description, God's only commandment, and God's only dream for humanity." Examine your faith. Do you believe this about Jesus Christ?



Opening Prayer: Fifth Week of Easter

Almighty ever-living God, constantly accomplish the Paschal Mystery within us, that those you were pleased to make new in Holy Baptism may, under Your protective care, bear much fruit and come to the joys of life eternal. Through our Lord Jesus Christ, Your Son, who lives and reigns with You in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever.



Holy Communion "Under Both Species": Bishop Earl Fernandes has granted permission on a trial basis (ad experimentum in Latin) to resume receiving Holy Communion under

the sacramental signs of bread and wine. The liturgical practice of receiving Holy Communion (the Precious Blood) from a common cup was discontinued at the very beginning of the COVID-19 pandemic in March of 2020.

Here at Holy Spirit and St. Philip the Apostle Parishes, we shall resume the protocols used prior to the onset of COVID-19. The Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion will offer the chalice to the communicant and say, "The Blood of Christ"; the communicant responds, "Amen" and receives the cup with two hands into his/her own hands; consumes a modest portion (sip) from the cup and hands the cup back to the minister. Please perform this sacramental action slowly, conscientiously, and reverently.

Receiving Holy Communion from the cup remains OPTIONAL, should anyone have health concerns or still be wary of contracting any illness (or virus). The full physical and spiritual presence of Jesus Christ in the Eucharist is contained in the consecrated host, without reception from the cup being seen as something "additional" or "extra." No additional grace is received by reception under both sacramental signs.


May is Mental Health Month.

According to the National Institute of Health, in a given year, about one in four people have a diagnosable mental disorder, such as depression, bi-polar disease, schizophrenia, among others. One in 17 people has a severe mental illness.

Mental illness encompasses biological, psychological, social and spiritual dimensions of the individuals affected. The illness also impacts the lives of the person's family.

Severe mental illness often raises profound questions of faith, such as, "Why does God allow sickness?" or "Why me?" As a faith community, we are called to support individuals and their families through their time of crisis when the illness first occurs, and in the ensuing life and ongoing management of it.

The spiritual dimension is critical to the recovery process. We can offer spiritual comfort through our prayerful presence in people's lives, by acknowledging their pain and supporting them through the healing process.



Having a Child Baptized?

Here at Holy Spirit, we have some helpful guidelines in preparing a family to have their child baptized.

- All parents must attend a Baptism Preparation class. The class is offered on the third Sunday of every month after the 11:00 a.m. Mass, in the parish office. Preregistration for this class is requested at least one week prior to the class.
- In order to register for the Baptism Preparation Class, the parents must be registered parishioners of Holy Spirit for at least 6 months. If you are not currently registered, we can assist you and register you for an upcoming class.
- Generally, Baptisms take place after 11:00 a.m. Mass on the first and last Sundays of the month. Please note that other children may be baptized on the same day as your child. We do not baptize during the season of Lent. We also do not schedule Baptisms on Sundays that take place near Holy Days or major holidays.
- The Sacrament may be celebrated in English or Spanish. Please understand that a Baptism may be scheduled in another language on the Sunday you desire. Your child's Baptism may need to be scheduled on another Sunday.




