From the Pastor's Desk...

The Gospel for the Eleventh Sunday in Ordinary Time comes from the Gospel of Matthew – the “A Cycle” of Gospel Readings, which began on the first Sunday of Advent last December. Going forward, it is important to remember that Matthew composed his Gospel for a Jewish-Christian audience. It is the only Gospel written originally in Aramaic – the language of Jesus’ time, and not in Greek as were the other three Gospels.

I choose to focus on the opening lines of today’s Gospel: “At the sight of the crowds, Jesus’ heart was moved to pity for them, because they were troubled and abandoned, like sheep without a shepherd.” Jesus then speaks to His pressing concern: “The harvest is abundant, but the laborers are few; so ask the master of the harvest to send out laborers for his harvest.”

We often believe that our times are unlike those of previous centuries. Not so. In Jesus’ day, there were the abandoned, the lost, the forgotten, as well as the sense that whole groups of people had religious needs and yearnings that went unmet. In our times, we experience an over-abundance of folks who seem lost in our vast technological and media saturated environment. We the Church and society in general lack “the workers:” the priests, members of religious orders as well as a shortage of nurses, teachers, and laborers in general. Jesus came however to proclaim the Kingdom of Heaven and so he chooses and commissions the Apostles to go out and teach in His name.

Today, the Church is faced with a severe shortage of priests, religious sisters and brothers. We even need more deacons. For this reason, when we pray to God, the master of the harvest, we must remember that vocations for the Church come from us – from our parishes and families. God calls these individuals, but our young people need open hearts and souls to respond to such a challenging call from God.

Could one reason for the shortage be that we raise and educate our young people for success in this world only? Do we equate success with the beautiful new home, material possessions, and high salaries without getting to the heart of the matter? We need to attend to our spiritual selves, our need for God and what God offers: eternal life with him. We, too, have countless lost souls and abandoned sheep. We need to seek first the Kingdom of God, and all else besides will be given us.

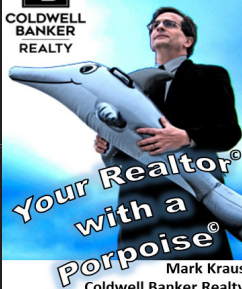

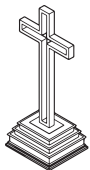
