From the Pastor's Desk...

The Gospel for today, Trinity Sunday, opens with some of the most oft quoted lines from the Gospel of John:

“God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him might not perish, but might have eternal life.”

– John 3:16

In describing the love God has for humanity and the entire world, John attempts to describe the enormity of God's love and mercy. The Creator sends His very own self – His Son – into creation to show the way back to Him. In an often-overlooked thought, however, John wrote that the Son brings salvation, not condemnation. Precisely on this point, many believing Christians get lost.

We have all grown up spiritually with different pictures, images, or characteristics of God. The greatest mistake many Christians have made in describing God is to use flawed human qualities. Human beings are flawed – we show anger, jealousy, and an unforgiving attitude. People can be vengeful and feel resentful when ignored or offended. Good believers often unconsciously slip into these descriptions of God, and in the process, paint an image of God as mean-spirited, a God who is a hardline enforcer, a God who is judge, jury and executioner.

Several weeks ago, Jesus taught us in the Gospel that in seeing the Son, we have witnessed all we need to know about God. In Jesus Christ, we have an exhaustive description of God. Jesus announced the love of God for all humanity, sinners included. Too many still hope and reckon for a great, destructive judgement of God on the mess we have made in this world. They believe others come to faith in God through threats, fear, and condemnation. No, the Gospel – the Good News – is that God loves this world He has created. He sent His Son as the ultimate proof of His love.

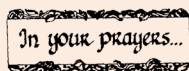

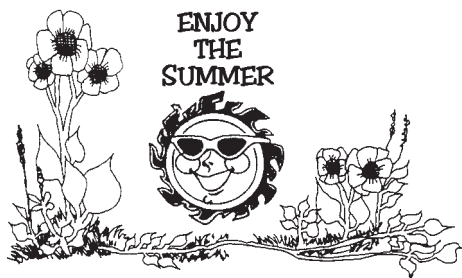

Help Protect the Dignity of Life in Ohio:

Life in its earliest and most vulnerable stages is threatened by groups proposing an amendment to the Ohio Constitution for the November 2023 ballot to expand and enshrine abortion at the expense of protections for preborn children and women.

The Catechism of the Catholic Church proclaims that “human life must be respected and protected absolutely from the moment of conception.” The Church accompanies and supports women facing unexpected pregnancies and mothers through programs like Walking with Moms in Need and the services of Catholic Charities.

The bishops of Ohio strongly encourage Catholics statewide to unite in prayer and work to defeat this proposed amendment and its grave consequences for women and preborn children in Ohio. Starting this week, the following **Protect Them Both** materials about the proposed amendment are available in Ohio parishes:

- **Protect Them Both Prayer Card:** Unite with Catholics across Ohio in asking God to strengthen us as we defend and accompany mothers and preborn children
- **Dignity of Life Threatened in Ohio Flyer:** Learn more about the proposed amendment and what you can do now.

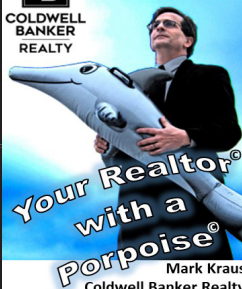

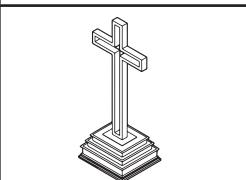
