From the Pastor's Desk...

Jesus is preparing to send the disciples out in today's Gospel. Hostility to Jesus and His message had already begun. Some faithful Jews rejected Jesus' claim to pronounce forgiveness for sin. The disciples had envisioned discipleship as a high honor, promising a position of influence and security in a restored kingdom of Israel. They must have sensed the potential danger and difficulties as they prepared to leave home, hearth and family behind.

They were going to preach to perfect strangers and they must have sensed that these first steps on this path were for them a turning point. The preaching of Jesus had attracted them, but now **His** mission was **their** mission. Leaving home and family behind is an important experience, which required complete commitment and the setting aside of all else.

“Christian” is seen in some quarters as an honorary title, preferable to being called Muslim, Jewish, secular or “something else.” Being a Christian disciple exacts a high price: taking up the cross and denial of one's self. We all may not be priests, sisters or missionaries, but the daunting challenge is equal for all Christians. We must be willing to lose our lives, placing aside personal dreams and wants. Christian commitment requires nothing less.

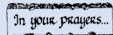



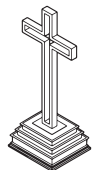
