From the Pastor's Desk...

I read a great summary of the meaning of this Sunday's Gospel for The Sixteenth Sunday of Ordinary Time. I think the following says it all quite well:

"A landowner's servants notify him that his crops have been corrupted. Somebody has sown alien seed in the field reserved for wheat. The servants are quick to offer to cleanse the land of the intrusion, but the landowner has a different point of view. He's not ready to make a final determination about the worth of everything growing out there. There may be some surprises, and harvest time will tell the final tale."

Jesus teaches His disciples several things in this parable. For one, He describes the kingdom of heaven to them. After all, how were the disciples to understand something that they could not readily see or measure or touch? He is also telling them that there would be people who wouldn't listen to their teaching and some people who would resist them, reject them, go after them, and be downright cruel – and evil. The kingdom of heaven here on earth is a place where good and evil compete side by side.

When you think of it, that is a great description of the world. All around us, we know people, see events, and experience situations that make us wonder why God allows evil in the world or permits evil people to win and prosper while they live. Jesus used a somewhat softer comparison – weeds in a wheat field, trying to choke out the good plants and grains before the harvest. Jesus even used some humor – the mustard plant is an invasive, pernicious weed, that crowds and chokes out all other plants around. Yet, He compares the growth and presence of the kingdom of heaven to this pest of a weed.

There are many Christian beliefs that are hard to accept – for example, not seeking to get even, or refusing to use violence to solve interpersonal or international problems. Jesus, in today's Gospel, instructs the disciples to act contrary to their feelings and gut urges. He tells them not to judge, not to seek to destroy evil people or their opponents. He tells them that God is in charge. It is God who created the weeds and the wheat, and in His wisdom, God will sort it all out. We, as disciples, are to build the kingdom, and in time, true and real disciples will stand out.

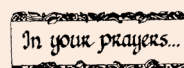
22, 2023: Save this date, St. Philip Parishioners.

Holy Spirit Parish's New Leadership – I received word of the names of the new occupants of the parish rectory as of December 1, 2023. That date is, of course, the planned date of my retirement from the active ministry at Holy Spirit. All three are priests of the Pallottine Order from India.

WITNESSES TO FREEDOM BLESSED MIGUEL PRO – “Viva Cristo Rey!”

As he faced a firing squad for serving the Catholic faithful in Mexico at a time when Catholicism was outlawed and severely persecuted, Fr. Miguel Pro of the Society of Jesus made a request. He asked to have a moment to pray on his knees, then he stood up, stretched out his arms in the imitation of Christ on the cross and submitted himself to his martyrdom, shouting “Viva Cristo Rey!”

This moment was photographed, and so we can look into the face of a martyr at the moment of his execution. What is astonishing about the images is the serenity with which Blessed Miguel submits himself to the state. He does not respond with violent resistance, because he is at peace with God. From that place of peace, the martyr triumphs over tyranny.

Due in part to Blessed Miguel’s witness, the Mexican government was shamed and an uprising gained the strength to stand up to religious persecution, as well as other injustices. He did not know it at the time, but his death inspired a larger defense of political and religious freedom.

Freedom through surrender is a paradox that is hard to understand and at times harder to live. Nonetheless, we are all called, like Blessed Miguel, to live in the freedom that only comes through an imitation of Christ’s faithful obedience.

Blessed Miguel’s life and death remains a witness to complete surrender to Christ in a way to which we might struggle to relate. Yet, we are all called to order our lives to Christ. We may not be asked to die for our faith, but we are asked to give each moment of the day to the Lord. This capacity requires freedom from sin, freedom from selfishness, freedom from all those things that stand between us and God.

Blessed Miguel Pro reminds us that even in extreme circumstances, we find true freedom when we live first for Christ. That witness, when adopted in our lives, may even inspire others to similar acts of love. **Blessed Miguel Pro, pray for us!**

Having a Child Baptized? Here at Holy Spirit, we have some helpful guidelines in preparing a family to have their child baptized.

- All parents must attend a Baptism preparation class. The class is offered every month at the Parish Office. Preregistration for this class is required. Call 614-861-1521 to register for the class.
- In order to register for the Baptism Preparation Class, the parents must be registered parishioners of Holy Spirit for at least six months. If you are not currently registered, we can assist you and register you for an upcoming class.
- Generally, Baptisms take place after 11:00 a.m. Mass on the first and last Sundays of the month. Please note that other children may be baptized on the same day as your child. We do not baptize during the season of Lent. We also do not schedule Baptisms on Sundays that take place near Holy Days or major holidays.
- The Sacrament may be celebrated in English or Spanish. Please understand that a Baptism may be scheduled in another language on the Sunday you desire. Your child’s Baptism may need to be scheduled on another Sunday.


