

#### From the Pastor's Desk...

In the Gospel of Matthew, the term "kingdom of heaven" refers to the actions of God in history, restoring the goodness God bestowed at the creation. All Christians should be working for that day when the justice, mercy and peace of God determines the whole order of creation. It may not happen in our day or lifetime. But how do we shape our own lives to become those disciples who seek tirelessly to create kingdom?

The following thoughts on today's Gospel offer good insight on how we might ready ourselves to be citizens of the kingdom. These points are taken from an article written by Fr. Michael Simone, S.J., for **America** magazine. Today's Gospel offers two short parables about the kingdom: the man purchasing a field in which he has found buried treasure; the second, a merchant seeking to find and purchase one pearl of great value.

- The value of the kingdom is not apparent to the untrained eye. The treasure hunter and the merchant possessed a keen eye that revealed the value of their finds. Christ's disciples must also be able to recognize the kingdom in our world, no matter how hidden. For us, this is sometimes hard to do.
- The kingdom, therefore, must be sought out. Not everyone simply stumbles upon hidden treasure or a valuable gem. The kingdom is apparent only to those with a trained eye, who know how to recognize the kingdom when they find it.
- Acquiring the kingdom requires courage and boldness. The treasure hunter and merchant are willing to take significant financial risks to get what they seek. Jesus encourages His disciples to be fearless in their response to God's call.
- The present sacrifice (the financial risk to purchase the field and the pearl), as well as casting the net into the sea, are hope-filled actions. In Matthew's Gospel, Jesus emphasizes the material and spiritual abundance that result from the adversities of discipleship (rejection, discouragement). Many people would undergo hardship for financial gain. Disciples need to do the same to attain the kingdom.

We hope and pray for the coming of the kingdom. Reflect on these thoughts when you pray the "Our Father." But, remember: a good disciple must be well versed in what to look for, to distinguish between what is truly of God and what is only of this world.


