From the Pastor’s Desk...

Primitive man believed that the forces of nature were possessed by powerful, angry gods. All ancient peoples greatly feared what they neither understood nor could control: the forces of storms and fire, violent earthquakes and raging waters. Primitive religions practiced appeasement of these gods, hoping through worship and sacrifice to win their favor and calm their tempers.

In the Old Testament, the ancient Hebrews held a somewhat similar belief. They saw in the clouds, wind and fire, the presence of their own God made real and visible to them. Recall the pillars of cloud and fire by day and night, which led the Israelites through the wilderness of the Sinai desert. A theophany, or an appearance of God, was accompanied by lightning, thunder, and earthquakes, as when Moses received the tablets of the Law on Mt. Sinai.

In today’s first reading, Elijah the prophet finds himself on Mt. Horeb (another name for Mt. Sinai). As he experiences the chaotic forces of nature – crashing rockslides, earthquakes, and fire – he does not find God. Fearfully, however, he detects the voice of God in the silence. He succeeds in hearing the voice of God as a whisper amid the turmoil and noise around him.

While Jesus is at prayer in the silence of the mountaintop, His disciples are engulfed by a raging storm on the sea. Overwhelmed by waves and wind, the disciples are seized with fear as they see Jesus – as a ghost – walking on the water toward them. Jesus tells them, “Take courage, it is I; do not be afraid.” Peter’s faith surges, then falters, as he sinks into the sea and cries out, “Lord, save me!” As the storm recedes and the water calms, they recognize Jesus as the Son of God in the silence after the storm.

These readings teach us an important lesson. We need to see God and recognize His presence amid the trouble, the noise, and the storms of our lives. It is indeed difficult to hear God’s voice when the turmoil of life overwhelms us. We need always to be courageous, and courage does not always come easily. Our faith may falter, as did Peter’s when he sank into the waves. But hearing the voice of Jesus, we need to take courage and not be afraid.

The Assumption of Mary, Tuesday, August 15th: This dogma of faith, proclaimed by Pope Pius XII in 1954, professes our belief in the bodily resurrection and glorification of Mary, the Mother of God.

The belief about Mary was not “invented” or formulated in the modern Church. In early Church tradition, this feast was known as the “Dormition” or falling asleep of Mary, indicating her death. But the early Church believed that the mortal body of Mary was preserved from corruption in the grave, because of her great privilege of and willingness of being the Mother of God.

The Feast of the Assumption of Mary is a Holy Day of Obligation this year, and the schedule of Masses is as follows:

Tuesday, August 15: Mass at St. Philip – 9:00 a.m.

Tuesday, August 15: Mass at Holy Spirit – 7:00 p.m.

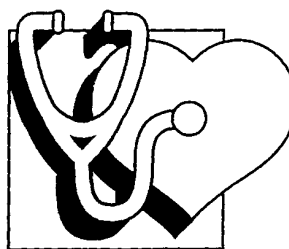



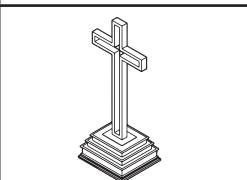
