From the Pastor's Desk...

You might wish to know why, every five years or so, the Church celebrates the Transfiguration of the Lord at the Sunday liturgy. Today's feast is a feast of the Lord, therefore, it may replace, or "suppress" (as the expression goes), a Sunday of Ordinary Time (this year, the 18th Sunday of Ordinary Time).

This feast was inserted into the Roman calendar on August 6 by Pope Callistus III back in 1457. It was done to commemorate the defeat of the Turks at Belgrade. During the Middle Ages, Europe successfully resisted several invasions by the Turks from the Middle East. The Gospel of the Transfiguration is also proclaimed each year on the Second Sunday of Lent. Interestingly, this Feast of the Transfiguration falls 40 days before the Exaltation of the Holy Cross on September 14.

The three disciples receive on the mountaintop the vision of Jesus as He really is. Actually, the vision of the transformed, risen Christ, is offered to them to strengthen their own faith. They are being instructed about the hardships and challenges of discipleship. They do not as yet understand that the glory of the transfigured Lord comes only after the experience of the Cross and Calvary. The disciples do not yet believe that Jesus' ministry will end in betrayal, arrest, and public humiliation by death as a common criminal.

Faith is given to lead us to a deeper, more genuine discipleship. There is a price to be paid. The faith experience is not described by glory and victory in this life, as many Christians wish to experience it exclusively. Faith is not a guarantee to an easy, comfortable life. Faith leads to stronger and more committed discipleship. Jesus is preparing His disciples for glory, but it is a glory only after we understand, embrace, and accept the cross.

Election Day, August 8, 2023: There is a special election being held this Tuesday on Issue 1. If passed, this ballot measure would require the Ohio Constitution to be amended or changed by a 60% majority of voters.

Currently, the Ohio Constitution may be amended by a 50% + 1 majority of voters (in effect ever since 1912).

I vote and I discuss politics with friends and family. It has never been my practice to discuss how I will vote on any candidate or issue from the pulpit, or for that matter, to tell you or ask you to vote for any specific candidate or issue. (I have, however, always urged a "yes" vote to approve mental health services levies.)

The Ohio Catholic Conference has issued a neutral recommendation on how Catholics might or should vote on Issue 1. I do believe we all have the responsibility to vote and to inform our consciences about candidates or issues before we vote. The Second Vatican Council has urged us to form our individual personal conscience in the exercise of our right to vote.

The Assumption of Mary, Tuesday, August 15th: This dogma of faith, proclaimed by Pope Pius XII in 1954, professes our belief in the bodily Resurrection and glorification of Mary, the Mother of God.

The belief about Mary was not "invented" or formulated in the modern Church. In early Church tradition, this feast was known as the "Dormition" or falling asleep of Mary, indicating her death. But the early Church believed that the mortal body of Mary was preserved from corruption in the grave, because of her great privilege of and willingness of being the Mother of God.

The Feast of the Assumption of Mary is a Holy Day of Obligation this year, and the schedule of Masses is as follows:


