## From the Pastor's Desk...

If you recall last week's Gospel, the workers in the vineyard who worked all day thought the owner of the vineyard was unfair when he gave those workers who came later in the day the same wage they received. After all, they worked longer and harder and should receive more pay, or so they thought. The first reading from today's Mass echoes that idea. The people Ezekiel spoke to said: "The Lord's way is not fair." To which God responds through the prophet: "Is it my way that is unfair, or rather, are not your ways unfair?"

In today's Gospel, Jesus addressed the chief priests and elders, who are beginning to reject Jesus and His teaching. The parable He tells is actually about them! The first son, who said he would not do what his father wanted, represents sinners. They know what God wants – they say no – but later have second thoughts, change their minds and do what God asks. The second son represents the religious leaders, who have rejected Jesus. They say "yes" to God and say they will do what God wants, but end up not doing what they said they would do.

The call of the Gospel is always a call to repentance. Jesus is calling the people to turn away from their public "no" to God and to do God's will. Repentant people do just that. They see the error of their ways and end up doing the right thing. This is God's way – accepting back those who have made mistakes. That's how Jesus shocked the chief priests and elders. He told them that all kinds of sinners were coming into the kingdom before they do. God does not want us publicly proclaiming our belief in His way of life (the second son) and then walking away, and during the week, doing something quite different from what we believe.

**2023 Morocco Earthquake:** On Friday, September 8, a magnitude 6.8 earthquake struck Morocco. The epicenter was in the High Atlas Mountains, where hard-to-reach communities suffered the most severe damage. More than 300,000 people are affected and at least 2,600 were killed. Access to remote areas with the worst destruction – especially in mountain towns – remains difficult. Catholic Relief Services is supporting Caritas Rabat, whose teams mobilized within 24 hours to the hardest-to-reach areas. Parallel to a robust response from the Moroccan government and bilateral assistance from a number of countries, Caritas has identified priority areas for support where essential relief supplies will be sent to families in the coming days. 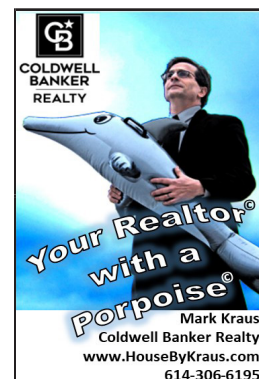

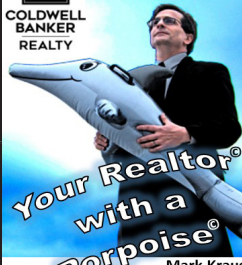

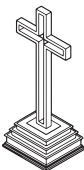
