From the Pastor's Desk...

“Fairness” turns out to be a really difficult thing to judge. What seems fair to one person in a particular case doesn't seem fair to another. As we experience life, all of us have heard that life itself isn't necessarily fair. Learning to live means learning to absorb a little bit of “unfairness,” every now and then.

The parable in today's Gospel is not necessarily about “fairness.” The workers who arrived early and worked all day received the wage they agreed upon with the owner of the vineyard. Was the owner unfair or even unjust to these laborers? After all, the owner did keep his word and held to his agreement. He paid the “early bird” workers exactly what he said he would.

Obviously, the workers who sweated it out all day (and received a full day's pay) did not appreciate the generosity of the vineyard owner. “Fairness” would seem to dictate that those who work longer hours should get paid more than workers who worked fewer hours. But the paymaster (or vineyard owner) decided to be extraordinarily generous. Perhaps grateful that he found enough workers to harvest the grapes before the end of the day, he decides to pay the late hired as much as the first arrivals.

The Gospel today needs to be understood in the light of the first reading from the Prophet Isaiah. The prophet speaks for God: “My thoughts are not your thoughts, my ways are not your ways.” God, in the parable, is represented by the owner of the vineyard. God is generous in the extreme. God's blessings and forgiveness are given out as God wills, not based on a time clock as in the workplace. Human generosity cannot match divine generosity. God does not share human thinking, determining grace or forgiveness based on concepts of merit.

There are many Christians who live a devoted, strong life for many decades. Others come to accept God only at a later point in their life. Nonetheless, the reward of eternal life is given based on any stirring of good will and faith, which ultimately is known by God alone. No matter how hard we might try, we could never be as generous as God. Yet all of us have experienced the generosity of God in so many ways. “Let God be God” is the point of the parable – overly generous, extremely merciful, always forgiving. We should try to be more like God.

Shared Parish Information

Twenty-Fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time

O God, who founded all the commands of Your sacred Law upon love of You and of our neighbor, grant that, by keeping Your precepts, we may merit to attain eternal life.

Through our Lord Jesus Christ, Your Son, who lives and reigns with You in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever.

National Migration Week, September 18-24, 2023: This week is an opportunity to reflect on the circumstances confronting migrants, including refugees, children, and victims and survivors of human trafficking. Each of us has a family migration story, some recent and others in the distant past. Regardless of where we came from, we are part of the human family and are called to live in solidarity with one another.

Immigrants who come to the United States, and particularly those who are undocumented, are a vulnerable population who need someone to speak on behalf of their human rights and dignity. Our moral tradition calls on all people of faith to stand up in defense of life and human dignity; it is a fundamental calling for us as Catholics. Scripture speaks repeatedly of the migration experience, from Abraham who was sent out from his homeland in the Old Testament, to the Holy Family who fled Herod and lived their lives for a time as refugees in a foreign land.

Jesus tells us that when we throw a banquet, we should not invite our relatives or wealthy neighbors, “but the poor, the crippled, the lame and the blind” (Lk 14). It does not mean we are obligated to invite all of the world’s poor into our country and disregard the well-being of those who are already here. Rather, this passage invites us to reflect on the degree to which we, in our surplus, provide to those who live in a state of deficit. Where we are able to provide support and care for the poor and the downtrodden out of our excess, we are obligated to help. Catholic social teaching tells us a great deal about our obligation to “welcome the stranger among us.”

He studied at his diocesan Catholic high school. As a boy, he used to serve at the altar for daily Masses. Being an altar server inspired him to take a step closer to God. Therefore, he decided to join the priesthood, and **joined the Pallottines in 2006**. He earned his BA in English literature at Loyola College, Chennai, Philosophy in Goa, and Sacred Theology in Mysore. **He was ordained in 2018**. After ordination, he was assigned as associate pastor at St. Antony Church, Kanyakumari in 2018 and in 2019, worked as associate pastor at St. Vincent Pallotti Church, Madurai. In 2020, he worked as associate pastor at St. Michael Church, Sivagangai. In 2021, he was bursar for the philosophical seminary at Trichy. In 2022, he was appointed as Pastor at St. Joseph Church, Pechiparai, Kanyakumari. As a priest, the thing that he loves the most is working in the parishes catering to the spiritual needs of the people. Fr. Richard, as he prefers to be called, is currently the Parochial Vicar of St. Philip and Holy Spirit Parishes, and on December 1st, will officially become the pastor of Holy Spirit Parish.



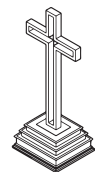
