From the Pastor's Desk...

We hear today one of the most famous passages from the Gospels: "...Repay to Caesar what belongs to Caesar and to God what belongs to God." This statement by Jesus is fairly straightforward, but the question still needs to be answered. What are the things rightfully due Caesar and what is rightfully owed to God alone? Today's readings do provide some insight.

We believe all authority comes from God alone. In the first reading from Isaiah, we hear that it is God who is the Lord and there is no other. God has "anointed" (chosen) Cyrus, King of the Persian Empire, to carry out His will. Cyrus will be the special instrument of God to release the Jews held captive by the Babylonian Empire, in exile from their homeland. Cyrus, a pagan, will allow the Jewish people to return home after fifty years of captivity. They will go home to Jerusalem and rebuild their temple and homeland.

The Pharisees in the Gospel were attempting to trap Jesus. If he responded "pay the tax" He would be seen as offering obedience to the Roman, Caesar, and betraying His own people. Should He have encouraged the non-payment of the tax, He would have been seen as siding with insurrection and the revolutionary Jewish zealots. It is, in fact, the Pharisees who are hypocritical. It is they who handle the Roman coin with the image of Caesar, himself a "divine" figure within the empire. Handling pagan coinage with an image of their "human God" was itself an act of self-desecration for a good Jew. The Jews believed that God alone was owed homage as the Divine Being.

Jesus' answer is simple. The Roman coin, minted by Rome, belonged to the Emperor Tiberius and should be paid to him. But what is owed to God? God is never paid with the currency created by earthly governments or man-invented economic systems. Remember what Jesus also said: "Serve the Lord, your God, with all your heart, all your mind, and all your soul. Love your neighbor as yourself." And when these two values conflict, God is still in charge. This is the belief of the Christian disciple.

Capital Punishment: As people formed by the Gospel, we are committed to respecting the gift

of human life, from the moment of conception to the moment of natural death.

Marking the anniversary of the *Catechism of the Catholic Church*, Pope Francis said the catechism's discussion of the death penalty, already formally amended by St. John Paul II, needs to be even more explicitly against capital punishment.

Capital punishment, he said, "heavily wounds human dignity" and is an "inhuman measure."

"It is, in itself, contrary to the Gospel, because a decision is voluntarily made to suppress a human life, which is always sacred in the eyes of the Creator and of whom, in the last analysis, only God can be the true judge and guarantor," the pope said.

The death penalty, he said, not only extinguishes a human life, it extinguishes the possibility that the person, recognizing his or her errors, will request forgiveness and begin a new life.

The church's position on the death penalty, he said, is one example of how church teaching is not static, but grows and deepens along with a growth in faith and in response to modern questions and concerns.

Important Election on November 7: In addition to many local election races for mayor and city council, there are two important issues on the state-wide ballot, Issue 1 and Issue 2 – which require our attention as responsible citizens.

The following two ballot issues may be "oversimplified," but essentially both issues can be seen as follows:

State Issue 1: If adopted by majority vote, the "right of choice" – whether to permit an abortion as a legal medical procedure – would be adopted as part of the State Constitution. The Ohio Conference of Catholic Bishops urges a "no Vote on Issue 1," in order to protect the value of the life of the unborn child in the womb.

State Issue 2: If adopted by majority vote, the legalization of recreational marijuana would be permitted in the State of Ohio. The Ohio Conference of Catholic Bishops recommends a "No Vote on Issue 2," given the potential danger inherent in the recreational use of marijuana products by individuals.

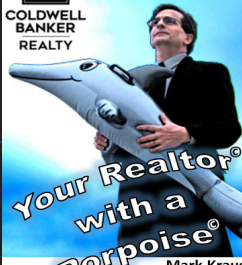

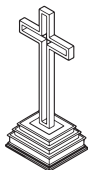
