From the Pastor's Desk...

November always signals the end of the Church Liturgical Calendar. The Gospels naturally focus on the end of time and how Jesus Himself understood such topics as the final judgement, salvation, and condemnation. On this, the 32nd Sunday in Ordinary Time, we read the Parable of the Ten Bridesmaids, five of whom were wise, and five who were foolish.

“Apocalyptic” literature is always imaginative and future-oriented. It exhorts people who are suffering to stand firm; it warns people of coming judgement; it encourages righteous living in the present. It urges vigilance, patience, waiting, and preparedness. This kind of literature is, however, always hopeful. God’s final victory is coming, at a time, however, unknown to us.

According to this parable, the bridesmaids (the 10 virgins) await the arrival of the bride and groom at their new home. The wedding celebration lasts well into the night, so it is altogether understandable why these attendants-in-waiting fall asleep – quite a natural human thing to do. This parable focuses, however, not on the sleepiness of these bridesmaids, but instead on their preparedness, even while they sleep.

I always emphasize what is called the **Five “P” Principle** – “prior planning prevents poor performance.” Five of the bridesmaids fell asleep, with no oil in their lamps. They were unprepared for the arrival of the Bridegroom. And so, Jesus’ point: we are always to live a righteous life and perform acts of faith, because we do not know when the end of time or our own personal end might come. We should always have enough “oil” – a symbol which represents the good works of mercy and justice, expected of all people of Christian faith. Always be prepared, for faith consists of works and deeds, not just belief!

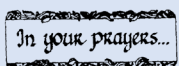

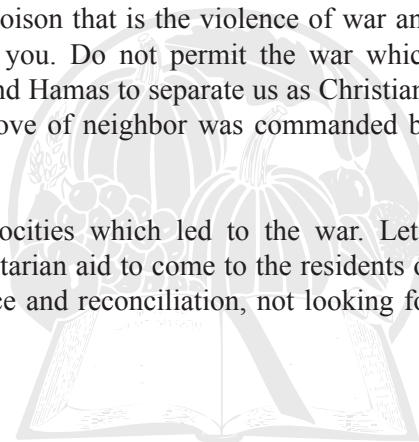
The Second Greatest Commandment:

Do not permit the poison that is the violence of war and hate speech to change you. Do not permit the war which wages between Israel and Hamas to separate us as Christians from this core belief: love of neighbor was commanded by Jesus Christ.

Let's abhor the atrocities which led to the war. Let's also insist upon humanitarian aid to come to the residents of Gaza. We pray for peace and reconciliation, not looking for scapegoats.

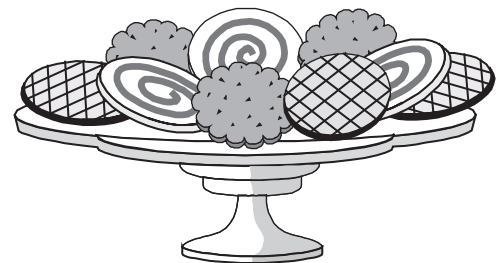

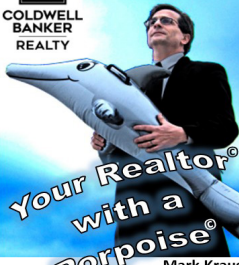

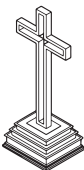
