**From the Pastor's Desk...**

The Hebrews of Biblical times were nomads, as were many different people of ancient times. Even as they later claimed land and established boundaries, the image of the shepherds remained important and powerful. For Israel, it was probably David, who was once a shepherd and later a King, who combined both these roles as guide, protector, and ruler. The sheep were raised not primarily for slaughter and food, but for their wool. Every good shepherd “connected” with the sheep, protected them, and nurtured their increase in numbers, even as they sheltered the weak and sought out the stray animals.

The readings for this feast of Christ the King draw heavily from the image of the shepherd, even as they combine the role of a wise strong ruler king who knows how to shepherd his subjects. The king does more than protect the sheep. He seeks out the lost, brings back the strayed, and binds up the injured. The wise shepherd and king mete out justice, protecting the weak from the strong. The king of today's Gospel even identifies himself with the neediest and the vulnerable among his flock.

This is the most remarkable aspect of this last Judgment scene out of the Gospel of Matthew. This king, wise judge, and shepherd so cares for his sheep that he sees himself in them. He judges the assembled multitude on how they as individuals see him – the king – in the weakest among the flock. His judgment is based on not only the recognition of the needs of the neediest, but also on the response to those needs. Did they show concern and mercy, and then jump into action to care for the shabby and unimportant?

Life is full of many tasks, as we all know. Students are tested in school, and adults are constantly tested on how they respond to the crisis of daily living. At the end of our lives, today's Gospel describes a different test, and a final one at that. Did we feed the hungry, give water to the thirsty, clothe the needy, visit the sick and those in prison? Did we actually motivate ourselves to act on their needs? The powerful and caring shepherd is always aware of the plight of the forgotten and unimportant, and he expects us to be attentive to these, the least important and overlooked members of the flock. How will we answer these questions on the final test?

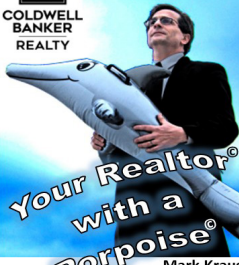

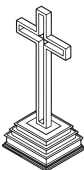

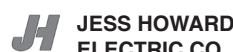
