

Do you remember that night in Rome over ten years ago when Pope Francis was elected? Coming out to the balcony at St. Peter's Basilica, he acknowledged the applause of the massive throng below him on St. Peter's Square. Many wondered who this "new man" was, whom they before this moment never knew. Breaking with past traditions, he bowed down and asked for their prayers, their blessing, and their support.


His gesture of humility told us a lot about Pope Francis' sense of humility. The formal title of the Holy Father is the "Servant of the servants of God." He knows the enormity of the task. He knows that his "calling" from God is so different from that of the thousands in the square below him. His request for their prayers and blessings, however, showed that he did not think there are different "classes" in the Church.

We live in a world in which pecking order, rank, and class matter a whole lot more than service. Today's Gospel tells us that the authentic Christian does not seek to stand out or stand higher, but rather to simply serve God and others. Thus, the question is not "How can I rise above?" but rather "Who can I humbly serve?" The "greatest" person is always the best servant.

National Vocation Awareness Week, November 5-11, 2023: Did you know that in our country, compared to 30 years ago, there are 20,000 fewer priests and 130,000 fewer religious sisters? At the same time, the Catholic population has continued to grow

steadily. Many factors have contributed to the decline: growing secularism, a lengthened period of adolescence, attitudes about celibacy, etc. During Vocation Awareness week, please pray that young people in today's society will hear and respond to God's call. And do your part to encourage them to consider the priesthood and religious life.

One Vocation Leads to Another: "Let us not forget that Christian marriage is a vocation to holiness in the full sense of the word, and that the example of holy parents is the first condition favorable for the flowering of priestly and religious vocations."

- Pope Benedict XVI

Generous Single Life in Christ: The Church recognizes that some people, for various reasons, are not called or cannot live in vocations such as marriage or consecrated life. Nonetheless, the Catechism says "they can contribute greatly to the good of the human family (#2231). "Some live their situation in the spirit of the Beatitudes, serving God and neighbor in exemplary fashion." (CCC1658).



Important Election on November 7: In addition to many local election races for mayor and city council, there are two important issues on the state-wide ballot,

Issue 1 and Issue 2 – which require our attention as responsible citizens.

The following two ballot issues may be "oversimplified," but essentially both issues can be seen as follows:

State Issue 1: If adopted by majority vote, the "right of choice" – whether to permit an abortion as a legal medical procedure – would be adopted as part of the State Constitution. The Ohio Conference of Catholic Bishops urges a "No Vote on Issue 1," in order to protect the value of the life of the unborn child in the womb

State Issue 2: If adopted by majority vote, the legalization of recreational marijuana would be permitted in the State of Ohio. The Ohio Conference of Catholic Bishops recommends a "No Vote on Issue 2," given the potential danger inherent in the recreational use of marijuana products by individuals.



The Second Greatest Commandment: This Gospel was proclaimed last weekend, if you recall. This Commandment is "Love your neighbor as yourself." This includes, of course,

all people.

In the news as of late, we hear of unprovoked attacks against fellow Americans of the Jewish faith, as well as against individuals who are professed Muslims or are of Palestinian descent.

Do not permit the poison that is the violence of war and hate speech to change you. Do not permit the war which wages between Israel and Hamas to separate us as Christians from this core belief: love of neighbor was commanded by Jesus Christ.

Let's abhor the atrocities which led to the war. Let's also insist upon humanitarian aid to come to the residents of Gaza. We pray for peace and reconciliation, not looking for scapegoats.
