From the Pastor's Desk...

Jonah, the main character in the Old Testament book which bears his name, was never happy or satisfied with what God did. He did not want to go to Nineveh to preach repentance. He spends three days in the fish's belly after being thrown overboard by the sailors in the storm. If this treatment by God was not enough, he successfully preaches "repent" to the citizens of Nineveh. When they repented, God relents and decides not to punish the Ninevites.

Jonah tried to flee God's directive to go to Nineveh and he gets punished by God. The Ninevites experience God's wrath, and this, of course, angers Jonah, who had hoped that Israel's enemies in the ancient city would be severely punished. Interesting (and funny) how so many of us become disappointed, if not angry, when other people are not sufficiently punished for their wrongdoing. For ourselves, however, we prefer "getting off easy."

Today's Gospel offers a different perspective on sin and penance, and a contrast on the past versus the future. In announcing that the time of fulfillment – the Kingdom of God – is at hand, the word "repent" emphasizes a change of heart, a change of attitude, a new plan going forward for one's life. The disciples leave their old life behind and immediately follow Jesus. They change completely and seek after a new way of life.

I hope you understand this shift of emphasis. Yes, penance for sin requires us to make up for the wrong we have done. Justice means giving God and neighbor what is owed to them. But the word "repent" means **CHANGE.** God is interested not so much in "crime and punishment," but a changed, different future going forward. For interested disciples, change means looking to the future and a new way and a new vision of life and living. When we adopt a new vision, we begin to live for the Kingdom of God – in the here and now – and going forward.

Third Week in Ordinary Time

Almighty ever-living God, direct our actions according to Your good pleasure, that in the name of Your beloved Son we may abound in good works.

Through our Lord Jesus Christ, Your Son, who lives and reigns with You in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever.



What is Ordinary Time? After we celebrated the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord, the Church returned to Ordinary Time. This period will extend until Tuesday, February 13th, the day before Ash Wednesday. It will begin again on Monday,


May 20th, the day after the celebration of Pentecost, and extend all the way until the Saturday before the first Sunday of Advent, Saturday, November 30, 2024.

Keep in mind that every Sunday is intended to be a "little Easter." Sunday, the first day of the week, witnessed Jesus Christ rising from the dead. Our weekly Church liturgy centers around this central mystery of belief of Christian faith – the Resurrection.

The great liturgical seasons of Advent-Christmas and Lent-Easter are expansive celebrations of the Church's belief in Jesus Christ, the Incarnate Son of God, who in the great act of redemption, became flesh, was crucified, and rose from the dead. These two seasons are given added emphasis since they recall the central events of Salvation History.

But no Sunday is "ordinary." It is the day of the Lord, and at the same time, the goal of every week and the beginning of the next. Sundays are the "fabric" of Christian living – we offer our thanks to God in the celebration of the Eucharist. We hear the Gospel proclaimed and are fed with the Bread of Life, the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ himself.

Let's just say this: Ordinary Time refers to the prayers and worship of the Church outside of the Advent/Christmas and Lent/Easter celebrations. The color used for the Sunday Mass is green, as well as for weekdays, whose liturgy celebrates no particular saint or feast.

Director of Religious Education: Holy Spirit Catholic Church is currently looking for a Director of Religious Education. Holy Spirit is a parish community serving Whitehall and the Eastside of Columbus, Ohio. We are a multicultural parish and have a vibrant ministry of outreach in the area. It proclaims the gospel of Jesus and supports the needs of its diverse community through an array of ministries, liturgies and programs, including Holy Spirit Elementary School.

The DRE is responsible for developing and maintaining a parish-based ministry of evangelization and catechesis for children, youth, and adults. The DRE reaches out to families and individuals in the community, provides formal instruction and empowers parishioners to serve one another. The DRE fosters close communication and collaboration with other community organizations and parish ministries, especially Holy Spirit Elementary School. This position is an at-will position and may be terminated by the pastor.

The ideal candidate should have a bachelor's degree in education, catechesis, theology or a related field. A master's degree is preferred. Experience in this field is a plus. 
