





Celebrations of Christmas: During the Christmas season, the Church celebrates three major "appearances," "revelations," or "epiphanies" of Jesus Christ. Each represents a revelation of God's plan in time and history. Each carries a distinct character and purpose, and influences our own celebration of Christmas, especially in duration. Unfortunately, our religious observance of the Christmas season has long ago been overwhelmed by secular forces, primarily the commercial nature of the season. Consider the following:

- Christmas Day marks the beginning of our salvation. We celebrate the Incarnation, the taking on of human flesh by God. The birth of Emmanuel, "God With Us," signals the beginning of a new relationship between God and all humanity – God as one of us.
- The Epiphany (or the Visit of the Magi) is a special revelation of God in a human body to exotic visitors from a foreign land. The appearance of the "God became Man" is for the salvation of all humanity, Gentile and Jew alike.
- The Baptism of Jesus is the revelation by Water, Spirit, and eventually by Fire of the "beloved Son" of the Father. The identity of the Son is confirmed by the Voice of the Father, and through the ritual repentance by the water of Baptism.

God of all the Ages, as we anticipate Your rebirth among us, we ask that we might see the blessing of every generation.

May we look beyond our peers to those older and those younger. May we find all the wisdom, joy, and insight You have planted there and may we know Your gifts.

And may we each discover within ourselves the gifts we bring to this inter-generational world. As a result, may we grow in our own efforts toward peace.

Plenary Indulgence during Christmas Season: The Holy Father, Pope Francis, has granted the privilege of a plenary indulgence for all the faithful to celebrate the 800th anniversary of Christmas in Greccio, Italy. The indulgence is available from December 8, 2023, the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary, to February 2, 2024, Feast of the Presentation in the Temple of Our Lord Jesus Christ. The usual conditions for receiving plenary indulgence are:

- Confession of our sins;
- Receive Holy Communion;
- Pray for the intentions of the Holy Father (*Our Father* & *Hail Mary*);
- Have the interior disposition of complete detachment from sin.

Added to this – visit a church run by the Franciscans and stop in prayer in front of the Nativity scene set up there. In the Diocese of Columbus, Christ the King Parish and St. Thomas Parish are run by Franciscans. Those sick or unable to participate physically can obtain plenary indulgence by offering their sufferings to the crucified Lord and praying.

ODU to Host St. Thomas Aquinas Lecture on Jan. 25




Jubilee of the Sacred Heart Pilgrimage
