From the Pastor's Desk...

My dear brothers and sisters, Christian faith should never be thought of in the same way as the other religious systems. In those religious movements, their followers practice their religion independent from that religious founder. A follower of Confucianism, for example, simply follows the teachings of Confucious. He neither has, nor needs, nor seeks a personal relationship with Confucious himself. Likewise, a Buddhist can faithfully practice the precepts of Buddhism without being concerned about having any kind of personal relationship with Buddha.

But Jesus teaches us as His followers that we absolutely cannot practice His teachings without being connected to Him. Take away a real, living personally dependent relationship with Jesus Himself, and you no longer have a Christian faith as He taught it. He teaches that His followers could no longer bear fruit without Him. He invites us to abide by Him just as the branches abide in the vine. The branches draw life from the vine.

In order to enjoy a fulfilling and fruitful Christian life, we must be connected to Him in such a way as to draw our life from Him. We must allow our roots to grow down deep into Him and draw our daily nourishment for life from Him. Let us abide in Jesus.





SAINT JOSEPH THE WORKER

Saint of the Day: May 1

Patron Saint of: Universal Church

Pope Pius XII instituted the feast of Saint Joseph the Worker in 1955. This feast extends the long relationship between Joseph and the cause of workers in both Catholic faith and devotion. Beginning in the Book of Genesis, the dignity of human work has long been celebrated as a participation in the creative work of God. By work, humankind both fulfills the command found in Genesis to care for the earth (Gn 2:15) and to be productive in their labors. Saint Joseph, the carpenter and foster father of Jesus, is but one example of the holiness of human labor.

Jesus, too, was a carpenter. He learned the trade from Saint Joseph and spent his early adult years working side-by-side in Joseph's carpentry shop before leaving to pursue his ministry as preacher and healer. Pope John Paul II stated: "the Church considers it her task always to call attention to the dignity and rights of those who work, to condemn situations in which that dignity and those rights are violated, and to help to guide [social] changes so as to ensure authentic progress by man and society."

Saint Joseph is held up as a model of such work. Pius XII emphasized this when he said, "The spirit flows to you and to all men from the heart of the God-man, Savior of the world, but certainly, no worker was ever more completely and profoundly penetrated by it than the foster father of Jesus, who lived with Him in closest intimacy and community of family life and work."

In 1870, Pope Pius IX declared Saint Joseph the patron of the universal Church. In 1955, Pope Pius XII added the feast of Saint Joseph the Worker. This silent saint, who was given the noble task of caring and watching over the Virgin Mary and Jesus, now cares for and watches over the Church and models for all the dignity of human work.


