From the Pastor's Desk...

Jesus compares the Kingdom of God to the seeds that the sower scattered. When the sower sows the seeds, he does not know exactly how the seeds grow into mature grain. Even with modern technology, we do not really know how the seeds grow. So also, we cannot force the seeds to grow. All that we can do is plant, wait and see what will grow. We cannot really control all of what we plant. Growth often happens of the earth's own accord. We may help it along now and then, but we can't crack that shell open. We can't replicate those cells or rebuild those roots. We can only make sure of a hospitable atmosphere for growth. A power far beyond us takes care of the rest. So it is with the Kingdom of God.

The kingdom belongs to God and He knows how to grow it. It is not our concern. The problem is, we think that we grow the kingdom we want to be in charge of, and to make things happen. But not with the kingdom of God. Our main task is to sow the seed; to sow the word of God.

Everyone likes to see results. At least most people do. It is so good to see that your efforts have led to some results. It is not so with the Kingdom of God. We are only sent to scatter the seed. The seed will grow on its own without us even noticing. Because it is God's work. It is His kingdom. It may appear disappointing for us. We want to build the kingdom; we want to be in charge. But the Kingdom of God doesn't operate according to our rules and plans. That is why Pope John XXIII, having done what he could during the working hours of the day. He ended each day with a simple prayer: "It's your Church, God. I am going to bed."

We are not responsible for what will happen with the seed. The seed itself has the potential to grow and bear fruit. We are only responsible to sow. Of course, we need to be careful that what we sow in the same seed that Jesus left us to sow. This is where we need to be faithful in proclaiming the gospel of Christ.
