From the Pastor's Desk...

The Gospel of the Twelfth Sunday in Ordinary Time is a familiar one. The disciples are crossing the sea in a boat and suddenly a storm arose that threatened to send them and their fishing boat to the bottom. They cry out to Jesus: "Teacher, do you not care that we are perishing?" Jesus calms the raging storm, and asks them: "Why are you terrified? Do you not yet have faith?"

All of us experience the storms of our own personal lives. And surely, most of us have wondered if we can make it, if we can hold on, if we are going to snap. These chaotic storms of our lives come without warning and challenge our families, even our personal mental health. We find ourselves, like the disciples, frightened and afraid. Events like this challenge our faith. We ask ourselves, "Where is God in all this trouble?"

Faith does not always provide instant solutions or remedies. The storms and troubles of life are often long in brewing, and they require some thought, reflection, and patience to wind down. But we should never feel alone. God does not abandon us in our confusion, our doubt, our troubles. The key element is this: we need to turn to God, seek out God, ask God for guidance, direction, and calm. We must realize that God supplies His life – grace – necessary for any situation. We must never let anyone or anything convince us that because our problem does not go away right away, that God does not stand next to us in our troubles.

Director of Religious Education: Holy Spirit Catholic Church is currently looking for a Director of Religious Education. We are a multicultural parish and have a vibrant outreach ministry in the area. It proclaims the Gospel of Jesus and supports the needs of its diverse community through an array of ministries, liturgies and programs, including Holy Spirit Elementary School.

The DRE is responsible for developing and maintaining a parish-based ministry of evangelization and catechesis for children, youth, and adults. The DRE reaches out to families and individuals in the community, provides formal instruction and empowers parishioners to serve one another. The DRE fosters close communication and collaboration with other community organizations and parish ministries, especially Holy Spirit Elementary School. This position is an at-will position and may be terminated by the pastor.

The position of DRE is a full-time, 12-months-a-year position. The DRE must be a practicing Catholic and in good standing with the Church; a knowledgeable person of the faith and doctrines of the Catholic Church. The ideal candidate should have a bachelor's degree in education, catechesis, theology or a related field; a master's degree is preferred. Experience in this field is a plus. Fluency in Spanish would be an advantage.

Religious Freedom Week is June 22-29.

Religious freedom means that Catholics and all people of goodwill are free to seek the truth and to live in accordance with that truth, and so to strengthen our common life as a nation. The U.S. Catholic Bishops remind us of our call to follow Christ as missionary disciples by serving others and living our faith in all we do. This week, we are asked to pray, reflect, and take action on religious liberty, both here in this country and abroad.

Plenary Indulgence

A plenary indulgence is available for any of the Christian faithful participating in the National Eucharistic Pilgrimage between May 17 and July 16, 2024. The elderly, infirm, or those who cannot leave their homes for a serious reason, and who participate in spirit with the National Eucharistic Pilgrimage, uniting their prayers, pains, or inconveniences with Christ and the pilgrimage, may also receive the indulgence. The conditions for receiving the indulgence include all of the following: participating in the pilgrimage, making a sacramental Confession and receiving Holy Communion in the days leading up to or just after the pilgrimage participation, and praying for the intentions of the Holy Father. The indulgence may be applied to the souls in Purgatory.




