From the Pastor's Desk...

We read this weekend about the fall of our first parents in faith. I love the expression used in the Easter Proclamation on the Exulted regarding the sin of Adam: 'O truly necessary sin of Adam...O happy fault that earned us so great, so glorious a Redeemer!"

Adam and Eve, by sin, fell short of God's glory. Although it is disheartening, the second reading encourages us not to lose heart because God's mercy is ever present. God offers us the grace of forgiveness in Jesus Christ.

We, too, by our sins fall short of God's glory but that is the end of our story, we should not lose heart. God's mercy in Jesus has not come to an end. The conviction of the psalmist should be ones: "with the Lord there is mercy, in Him is plentiful redemption" (Psalm 130:7).

Jesus, our redeemer, has turned the misfortune of sin into a blessing for us, as I said earlier, referring to Exsultet. God's forgiveness flows ever freely but do we accept or refuse this favor? In today's Gospel, it gives us an instance where some people refused God's forgiveness offered in the ministry of Jesus. The scribes refused to accept God's mercy. That is why Jesus says the sin against the Holy Spirit can not be forgiven.

If we fall into sin, let us not lose heart. Rather knowing God's mercy is ever present because of Christ's sacrifice, let us promptly respond to the spirit's working in us to seek God's forgiveness.

Plenary Indulgence

A plenary indulgence is available for any of the Christian faithful participating in the National Eucharistic Pilgrimage between May 17 and July 16, 2024. The elderly, infirm, or those who cannot leave their homes for a serious reason, and who participate in spirit with the National Eucharistic Pilgrimage, uniting their prayers, pains, or inconveniences with Christ and the pilgrimage, may also receive the indulgence. The conditions for receiving the indulgence include all of the following: participating in the pilgrimage, making a sacramental Confession and receiving Holy Communion in the days leading up to or just after the pilgrimage participation, and praying for the intentions of the Holy Father. The indulgence may be applied to the souls in Purgatory.

Greetings brothers and sisters of Holy Spirit! I wanted to provide everyone with an update regarding my diaconate formation.

I am currently completing my spring classes (Catholic Social Teaching, and The History of the Catholic Church in America) and finishing Mass practicums where we are learning to serve as a deacon in the sanctuary during liturgies, especially the Mass. This July, I will complete a 5-day silent retreat. My ordination to the diaconate will take place on Saturday morning, August 10th, with Bishop Fernandes presiding.

Following ordination, Bishop Fernandes has assigned me to St. Pius X Parish in Reynoldsburg to begin my ministry as a deacon. While I am excited for this assignment, I am also saddened to be leaving the good people of Holy Spirit. My internship at Holy Spirit will conclude on June 16th.

I wanted to thank Fr. Richard, Deacon George Zimmerman and his wife Kathy, Fr. Arnold, Sister Carol, the entire parish staff, and all of the parishioners of Holy Spirit for your pravers and encouragement. I am so grateful for your hospitality, kindness, instruction, and patience during these last 18 months. I have grown spiritually and learned lots of practical knowledge through hands-on activities at Holy Spirit. Whenever anyone asks me about my internship, a smile immediately comes to my face as I explain how wonderful and accommodating this parish community is and how fruitful my experience has been. Lastly, I wanted to thank all of you for a gift that Father Richard and Holy Spirit gave me to commemorate my ordination; I was given a beautiful alb with "Alpha and Omega" stitched in lace in the sleeves and along the bottom. Every time I vest in this alb, I will remember the people of Holy Spirit and you will be with me as I proclaim the Gospel and serve at the altar. I will continue to keep all of you in my prayers and would ask the same from you for me and my family.
