From the Pastor's Desk...

Today's Gospel contains a story of two women – one, a young teenager who has an important father pleading her cause, and another – an older woman, worn by years, and persistent illness – who has no advocate, no one running interference for her.

Both these women are stories of faith. Jesus has to brush aside the drama and wailing of onlookers to heal the daughter of Jairus. Notice his young daughter has her father to plead her case. But the older woman, beset by constant hemorrhaging and doctor malpractice has no one. She anonymously slips up behind Jesus, believing that closeness to Jesus and contact with His garment will heal her. Her faith, in the end, is rewarded.

What are we to make of this older woman, who stealthily makes her way through the crowd to touch Jesus? The Gospel tells us that she had heard of Jesus, but because of her constant bleeding, she was impure – in other words, no admission to the temple or synagogue, and certainly unclean to touch a rabbi or Jewish holy man. She had to overcome this prohibition of Jewish law to encounter Jesus. He rewards her by calling her "daughter," a title Jesus grants to no other throughout the Gospels.

This older woman – unaided, anonymous, a "stealth cure," if you will – is a shining example of faith and belief. She had only heard of Jesus, yet she seeks out an encounter with Him. This is what God wants more than anything else from us – our desire and action to seek an "encounter" with Him. Jesus, by calling her daughter, became for her what she did not have – a source of help, security and healing. We have to demonstrate this sort of faith, to become His sons and daughters in life.


Plenary Indulgence

A plenary indulgence is available for any of the Christian faithful participating in the National Eucharistic Pilgrimage between May 17 and July 16, 2024. The elderly, infirm, or those who cannot leave their homes for a serious reason, and who participate in spirit with the

National Eucharistic Pilgrimage, uniting their prayers, pains, or inconveniences with Christ and the pilgrimage, may also receive the indulgence. The conditions for receiving the indulgence include all of the following: participating in the pilgrimage, making a sacramental Confession and receiving Holy Communion in the days leading up to or just after the pilgrimage participation, and praying for the intentions of the Holy Father. The indulgence may be applied to the souls in Purgatory.



We are calling upon all parishioners to prayerfully consider helping us to meet the growing need. If you are not already doing so, please consider utilizing the

- Instant oatmeal in individual pouches to provide a healthy and easy to prepare breakfast.
- "Fla-Vor-Ice" freezer treats (these are sold unfrozen, so we can store them in the pantry. They are a great item to cool down in the summer heat!
- Tea bags (a simple luxury for adults to relax in the midst of very busy days).
- "Knorr" Noodles. These come in multiple flavors and are a nice treat for families.

Please let us welcome him and respond generously to his appeal for his Diocese back in Ghana. Together with you, we can bring hope to the hopeless. May God richly bless you all!


